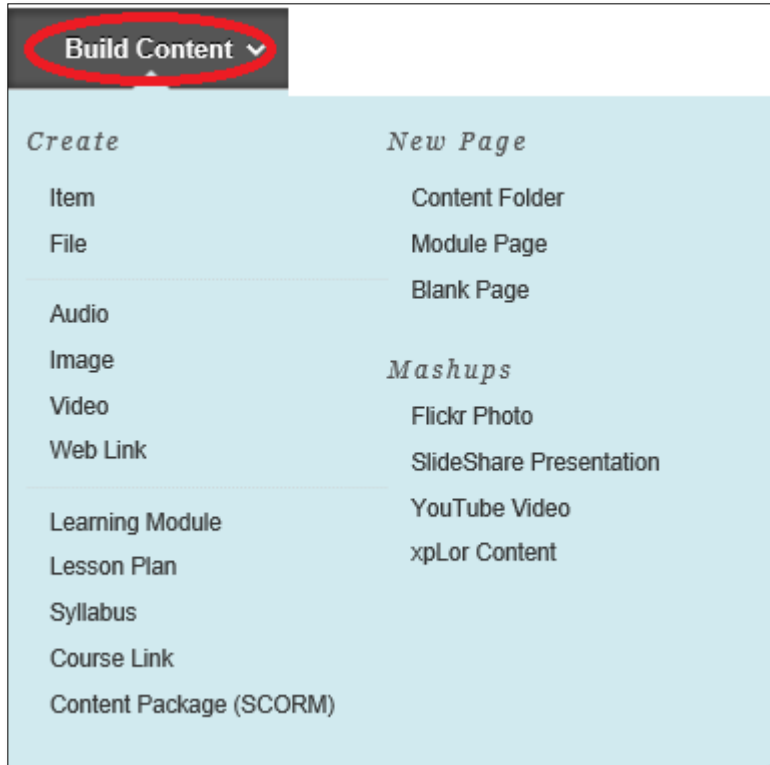


Blackboard Content Types

There are many different types of content available for use in Blackboard. Here is a chart that highlights the different types and a brief description of each.

Content Type	Description
Item	General piece of content, such as a file, image, text or link to which a description and other items can be attached.
File	HTML file that can be viewed as a page within your course or in a separate browser window.
Audio, Image, Video	Audio, video or graphic file from your computer incorporated into your course.
Web Link	Link to an outside website or resources.
Learning Module	Set of content that provides structured path for progressing through items.
Lesson Plan	Content type that combines information about the lesson itself with the curriculum resources used to teach it.
Syllabus	Course syllabus created by attaching existing file or walking through a syllabus builder tool.
Course Link	Shortcut to an item, tool or area in your course.
Content Folder	Course area that allows content to be structured via a hierarchy or categories.
Blank Page	Blank pages display files, images and text as a link in the course area without including a description.
Module Page	Page containing dynamic, personalized content modules that help users keep track of tasks, tests, assignments and new content created in the course.
Mashups	Mashups allow you to include content from an external site, such as Flickr, SlideShare and YouTube, in your course.
Publisher Content	High-quality digital content and interactive learning tools from content providers, such as Cengage Learning, McGraw-Hill Education, Macmillan Education, Pearson and Wiley, seamlessly integrated into Blackboard Learn.
