I feel the materials covered and the way they are presented are very applicable and allowed me to walk into a position in the field and feel confident. I have noticed I seem to have a better understanding of skills than those with BS degrees and I believe this is because of the smaller cohorts and the specified programming.

Q4 - What would you change about this program?

I think putting more scenarios in the curriculum to see what to do on a hands on situation.

There are a few classes that I would have liked to see online, Disabilities would have been a good class to offer online.

I think there needs to be more guidance in just getting into and through your program, and preparing you should you want to go on to get your Bachelors degree. From the start of my education I was misled by what classes I needed, when I should be taking them and getting into my program. Even once I was in my program there were so many questions on what I should and should not be taking. I know at one time I had a "mentor" from the program reach out to me, well when I asked for a meeting it never happened. I don't have the time to wait around, I just figured it out myself. I have enjoyed my time at Western, I just feel it should be easier to get in and get it done. My two year course took me three years? Not something as a single mom wants to have happen, but once I started I was not going to back out.

The changes I would have proposed have already been made. When I first started, there were many courses that were only offered at one time slot, one semester (either Spring or Fall). It was difficult to work them into a schedule and to take a full course load. Now there are multiple offerings.

The experience that some teachers have. I felt that we had newer teachers for some of our required courses. One of the main teachers was difficult to work with. He/she didn't give us feedback or our grades until the day they were due.

A few things I would change starting with how grades were done. The adjunct teachers though they were very developed in the field they worked with they were very new to teaching and I feel like my learning suffered a bit from a lot of their mistakes. I also feel as if us as students were compared often to others in certain classes an example was professional practice I could really feel a sense of it in that class. Also, a sense that with the new cohorts started there aren't enough time for us and that we became almost a burden. An example was when asking Xxxx why grades weren't done multiple times he/she would say he/she was busy with the night classes. Though I really respect him/her as a teacher I felt like we were pushed to the back burner.

The only thing I would suggest is that some of the instructors be more organized when it comes to grading.

Just getting grades in sooner and that's all I can think of.

When I began there was only one cohort that started in the fall, but that has been changed. That would have been one of my big suggestions. Another suggestion is just to make sure grades are kept up with. One thing that was difficult was having the field classes only be an hour long. I feel like we could have used atleast a half an hour more to not feel rushed.

I think there is a little bit of a lack or organization. It seems that no one ever really knows what is going on. There are reminders on blackboard but I think it would also be helpful for instructors to remind students of any upcoming projects or papers that need to be done. I think it would be helpful to do more hands on things also, being able to physically apply yourself is really helpful.

I came into the program with a good understanding of the needs in our community, compassion for the vulnerable populations and knowledge of community resources.

Make sure cohorts aren't stuck with newer teachers for all of their classes. For quite a few of our main courses, it was Xxxx's first time teaching the classes. We were often misguided and the classes were disorganized at times. My other required courses, I had teachers that it was their first time teaching the course. I felt like my learning suffered because of this. I believe I could of gotten more out of my learning. Don't have too many cohorts at the same time. We can feel the stress because the teachers are overwhelmed. We were often compared to the night cohort by one of the teachers as well.

At Western I felt very misguided by my initial advisor who wasn't sure what was needed to get into the Human Service program. Also, not knowing how long to expect to be on the wait list and then to suddenly have all these new opportunities is also frustrating because so many of us had to wait for so long. I also felt misguided about what classes I would need to transfer to a four-year. Along with while I was on the waiting list I feel like I should have been told what to take. Although, I understand there isn't a ceremony in the summer when the night co-hort should be walking for their degree. It almost feels rude they are walking with us when we have actually completed the whole program and they are being treated as if they have. When they still have one whole field experience to complete. I also think they should have a separate "reception" then us.

I am thankful for the privilege of having gone to Western. I am a first generation graduate, as well as a single mother. The courses were diverse enough that I was able to pick a schedule that worked perfectly for my life, and I gained a wealth of information form the classes in this program! Also, Project Proven was pivotal in my success as a student, mother, and member of the community. Western has given me the tools that I need to move forward and provide the best life possible for myself and my daughter. Thank you!
